# Q4 Grading Policy – Distance Learning

<p><b>Middle School Grades 5-8</b></p>	<p>Students will receive an Alma-generated report card for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter as follows:</p> <p><b><u>2 choices:</u></b>  <b>P-</b> Participated and Passed (participated in the class sessions and met standards at an 80% proficiency or higher on assignments during the DLP)  <b>I -</b>Incomplete (did not participate in class sessions and/or meet standards on assignments in the DLP)</p> <p>Traditional grades in ALMA will be converted at the end of the quarter to indicate the above criteria: P or I</p> <p><b><u>Final Grades:</u></b></p> <p>The final grade will be calculated from the first 3 quarters.</p>	<p>Teachers will keep track of assignments and progress in the ALMA gradebook.</p> <p>Teachers will focus on essential learning outcomes based on the key standards for the 4<sup>th</sup> nine weeks.</p> <p>Students will receive grades in Alma. Grades that are scored at an 80% or higher will have “met standard” for the week’s outcomes.</p> <p>Students will have the opportunity to work on all grades that are below 80% to resubmit/correct and improve the outcome. Teachers will use small group, 1:1 sessions and drop-in office hours to work with students for these assignments.</p> <p>Elective Classes will not be graded (Spanish for High School Credit is the one exception)</p>
<p><b>Middle school courses for High School credits</b></p>	<p>Students taking courses for high school credit <b>will</b> earn their credits. Their report cards will still reflect the <b>P</b> or <b>I</b> final grade for the quarter. We will work closely with High Schools for outgoing 8<sup>th</sup> graders’ transcripts to align with their high school of choice.</p>	<p>Same as 5-8</p>
